STEM Career Pathways for Community College Students



STEM Advantage kicked off our new STEM Career Pathways program at Pasadena City College and East Los Angeles College! The goal of this program is to help community college students understand career opportunities in a STEM field and paths to economic mobility, see the value of and feel motivated to earn a bachelor's degree in a STEM major, and increase the transfer rate to a 4-year university to earn a bachelor's degree. The program works with the CSUs and Community Colleges to help inform students how to optimize their community college experience and select a college that meets their needs. It is comprised of four key components: transfer and college selection tips, mentoring circles with STEM Advantage Alumni, professional

and career development programs, and events and online discussion groups to build community.

This new program was funded through a generous grant from the College Futures Foundation. We are excited to expand our programs to increase the number of diverse STEM students to earn a bachelor's degree and increase the pipeline of STEM talent.
